### **Speaker Profiles**

Roy Diblik is a noted author, plantsman and designer Roy Diblik has spent more than 30 years studying, growing, and enjoying plants. His passion for native plants and other perennials began with his work at the Natural Garden Nursery in St. Charles, Illinois, and has been cultivated through his establishment of Northwind Perennial Farm, a nursery in Burlington, Wisconsin. Roy's recent work includes a planting of the new Oceanarium at the Shedd Aquarium in Chicago and a garden for the modern wing of the Art Institute of Chicago. He is best known as the plantsman behind Piet Oudolf's midwestern garden designs, including the Lurie Garden at Millennium Park in Chicago. He is a sought-after speaker and regularly addresses audiences across the country. Roy is the author of the book The Know Maintenance Perennial Garden.

**Sandy Wilmot** has been a forest health specialist with the Department of Forests, Parks & Recreation for the past 28 years. She is a graduate of UVM with a Bachelor's degree in Botany and a Master's degree studying forest pests. Her work with the State has focused on monitoring changes in forest health and understanding the impacts of forest disturbances on forest health. For the past 10 years she has served as the point person within Forests, Parks & Recreation for climate change work, both forest carbon management and adapting forests to climate change.

**Ashley Robinson** was educated at the Landscape Institute in Cambridge MA, and worked for a renowned landscape architect, in MA. Ashley has managed several retail flower & garden shops, then moved to Vermont 10 years ago to start her own landscape design business.

**David Burton** of diStefano Landscaping, Inc. has a B.S. in Horticulture with a minor in Small Business Management from Virginia Tech. He has a great passion for seeing how businesses operate to provide a successful atmosphere for the owner, employee and client.

Rebecca Lindenmeyr has a B.S. in Environmental Science, and worked for EPA as a consultant for 9 years before shifting her career to sustainable design in 2001. As co-owner of Linden L.A.N.D. 
