Speaker Profiles

Barry Glick has been involved in the plant world since 1954, when at the young, impressionable age of 5, he witnessed Don Herbert (Mr. Wizard on TV) place a cutting of a plant in a glass of water only to sprout roots a few shows later. Barry replicated the experiment with his one of his mother's prized Coleus plants, and knew that he was hooked for life.

In 1972 he realized there was just not enough room for his plants and him in a big city environment, so he bought 60 acres of a 3650 foot high mountain top in Greenbrier County West Virginia where he founded Sunshine Farm & Gardens, started his plant collection, and has remained there since.

With a state of the art tissue culture laboratory, Sunshine Farm & Gardens is involved in experimental genetics on plant material, the goal of which is to develop new and better plants for the landscape and the garden. The commercial arm of the operation provides high quality, unusual plants at reasonable prices to garden centers, nurseries, landscape professionals and home gardeners worldwide.

The main focus of plant breeding at Sunshine Farm & Gardens is within the genus *Helleborus*. Barry maintains more than 175,000 flowering size Hellebore stock plants on a 6 acre section of the nursery for seed production. The other major primary focus at Sunshine Farm & Gardens is native plants. For more information about Barry visit www.sunfarm.com.

Brian Post started building dry stone walls at the age of 10 at his childhood home in Barnard, Vermont, He is one of just seven wallers in North America who has attained Master Craftsman certification from The Dry Stone Walling Association of Great Britain (DSWA-GB; the world standard). He is also a licensed Landscape Architect in Vermont; the only person in the U.S. to hold both distinctions. In 2010, he started Standing Stone Landscape Architecture a design/build firm focusing on dry stone projects. Additionally, Brian is the Executive Director of The Stone Trust, a non-profit education center for dry stone walling based in Dummerston VT. Brian has been published Fine Home Building, and is a DSWA-GB certified instructor and examiner. He teaches walling frequently throughout New England and beyond.
